## Pakistan's Growing Challenges Dr. W. Blythe Robinson

A week after the death of Osama Bin Laden I received a call from Pakistan informing me that Osama and I had been "neighbors" last year in Abbottabad. His death resulted in damaged relations between our two countries.

This had an adverse impact on my ministry when I attempted to obtain a Visa. What normally takes one week was stretched out for two months. I later discovered that they had issued the Visa earlier but held it back as a protest against America. While I was in Pakistan an American was taken hostage in the same city that was my base. Thankfully I was spared. Currently the political situation between the U. S. and Pakistan has deteriorated even further, threatening my plans to return next year.

Because of Visa delays I arrived when it was raining and flooding was occurring. We rode in an old dilapidated car that kept stalling out as we drove slowly through flooded streets and road ways. At one point I had to wade barefoot through sewer flooded streets to get a ride. Floods in areas where we hoped to travel and preach forced our plans to remain fluid.

For security reasons we would travel long distances for hours, conduct a service and return between midnight and dawn, fearing that it was unsafe to spend the night after preaching in public over a loud speaker. On one occasion a portion of the street was blocked off with only a brick wall separating us from the Pakistan military. We risked the consequences of letting them hear the message that they didn't want to be proclaimed.

On the Lord's Day I began my preaching theme for this trip which was a defense of historic Christianity. The Muslims are adamant in their belief that Jesus did not die on the cross. They insist that someone, who just looked like Jesus, took His place on the cross. Therefore my first message was to

prove beyond any doubt that it was the real Jesus who died. I offered an abundance of proof that His identity, while on the cross, was established beyond question. When I first preached this message some believed and came to obey the Gospel.

However at other meetings some would get up and walk away as soon as I mentioned the crucifixion. At one meeting they started walking away as soon as I said "crucified," but I kept preaching it, then others got up and walked away and I kept preaching it. A total of 6

left the service in a manner that demonstrated to all that they were offended by the preaching of the cross. I remember the words of Paul and wonder if he had similar experiences. He wrote, "...the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness but to us which are saved it is the power of God" [I Cor. 1:18]. Thankfully there were some at this service who chose to obey the Gospel.

Sometimes preaching the message of the Cross comes at a price such as when Satan afflicted me with sickness during a meeting. I struggled to complete the message but I was so sick that I could not continue to stand. I slumped down, leaning against a wall, asking the translator to continue, my attempt to conclude my message became increasingly difficult. Just as the invitation was to be given I had to turn the service over to him as I tried discreetly to move away to throw up. I didn't get far. I fell in the mud on my knees and face, almost passing out, as my stomach burned like fire. I had no medicine for this with me and we were hours from "home." Nothing helped even after I got back and took everything available for relief. Finally at 3:30 A.M., I induced vomiting and the fire in my stomach ceased a few hours later.

Another goal for this trip was to attempt to establish training centers for future Bible Classes. I proposed meeting with the ministers and church leaders before each service to discuss their interest in simple N. T. studies. This is one of the greatest challenges that I face. The preachers are the "gate keepers" to "their people." They have very little Bible training and Bibles are uncommon among the people. Illiteracy is wide spread and their concept of Christianity is a collection of confused ideas and traditions collected from various denominations.

Their denominational affiliation is often based more on money than conviction and their beliefs are seldom checked with the scriptures. The membership generally knows nothing beyond what they are told. Corruption among ministries is rampant in Pakistan – I learned this from ministers! It has been proven that some ministries have stolen from others by hacking into their websites and diverting funds. One "ministry" offered me all of the "converts" that I wanted. His price was "\$1.00 per convert." It is difficult to get any of them to work together. Many want to "own" an "American" for financial benefits to their ministry only. Some popular

## Barry Kermene Serves In India

I want to take this opportunity to thank every person who prayed about my recent trip to India. I also want to thank all those who helped with the trip financially. (individuals and churches) I got back to Louisville on Sept. 28th. I will tell you about some of the highlights of the trip, because it might be a few weeks before I send out a printed newsletter.

I was involved in 4 seminars while I was there. They were all in different locations. The attendance probably ranged from 40 to 175. The Indian preachers told us that those who attended were really interested in the topics that were covered. Our theme was UNITY THROUGH RESTORATION. There were good questions asked by those who were present after we finished teaching.

I had the opportunity to preach in 8 villages in two states. I preached in Tamil Nadu first. There were 37 souls who were baptized into Christ from 3 villages. After that, I spent the rest of the time in Andhra Pradesh. There were 53 who wanted to obey the gospel in 4 villages there. We thank the Lord for those decisions.

We were also able to leave \$1,000.00 with two preachers so that they could buy mosquito nets for the people in their areas. Those will help to prevent the spread of malaria. That amount may be enough to buy about 200 of them. I visited a White Fields orphanage in Andhra. Those children will also get mosquito nets. We were able to buy new bibles for about 35 of the preachers in the Sri Kalahasti area.



The pictures with this message were taken by Udaya Kumar. He is the man who leads in the Kalahasti area. The man on the cot was hit by a bus. One of the tires rolled over his leg. He works with Udaya. Some money was left to help him with living expenses.



preachers are successfully deceiving their American supporters. I continue to seek those who want the message more than money.

The Muslims seize upon these conflicting denominations, doctrines and practices to prove that the Christian faith was lost after Jesus and that a new Prophet, Muhammad, had to come to give the true revelation of God to man. I have personally been confronted about these divisions of Christianity. Muslims are confident that they have the better argument because they only have two divisions, the Sunnis and the Shias. From their stand point, "Christianity" has endless multitudes of divisions.

To help counter this I have pleaded for all Christians to simply limit themselves to the historic Christianity of the N.T. and abandon the various changes and traditions of men that have accumulated over the centuries. I have worked for three years with one congregation which now reports that they teach only what the Apostles taught regarding Baptism and the Lord's Supper. I have also urged them to practice I Thess. 5:17, Col. 4:16, & II Thess. 3:14. I implemented this in my last message by having different men of the church stand up and read various passages as I taught the Word.

Sometimes great efforts produced what seem like little results. On one trip I traveled for three hours to a remote place and three hours back on roads that felt like I was in a blender. I spent an additional four hours there and concluded my work by preaching a Bible message straight from the Biblical text. However, only one person responded. At first I felt so discouraged. Then I remembered the worth of one lost soul to Jesus and the great privilege that I had to present Christ to the crowd. I cling to Mt. 28:20, "I am with you always," as we all need to do at times of similar discouragement. I was later to learn that one Muslim woman had stood in the shadows for one hour listening intently to every word of the message. Others have done likewise from rooftops.



Thankfully this trip concluded with 193 victories for Christ. Praise the Lord for baptisms and please pray for your brothers and sisters. To all of you who have supported missions I say with Paul in 1 Cor.15:58 "your labor is not in vain in the Lord." I believe that this is true because of Who Jesus is, and the promise in Heb.11:6 "he that comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him."

We at White Fields want to diligently seek the lost; we are also seeking willing workers to go to different parts of the world [not necessarily Pakistan] and give them the same chance as we have to hear the message of Jesus. If the Lord has placed in your heart an interest in going, please let us hear from you today.



# Headed To Haiti

Haiti is a very terrible place. Over 7,000,000 souls live in terribly crowded conditions on the island. The average wage is 300 dollars per year. You can imagine how terrible the health conditions are with starvation rampant and disease taking its toll on so many lives. In addition Haiti has been ravaged the past few years with hurricanes and the terrible earthquake that took over 250,000 lives. This trip is not a vacation! It is the opposite. It is a difficult trip physically speaking, but very rewarding spiritually speaking.

There are currently 15 who have volunteered to go and work at the Jesus Loves Me Home in Haiti.: Bus York (who will be Projects Manager), Bob and Anna May Guarino, Truman and Tina Brady, John and Marcia Black, Nathan Parker, Tori Rifenbark, Kym Resler, Joyce Washburn, Reggie and Esther Thomas, Lori and Lacey Darnell.

There will be a Christmas celebration for the orphans and Lori and Lacey Darnell will be in charge of this. The orphans will receive new clothing, the orphanage will receive new kitchen utensils, and the celebration will end with the orphans enjoying a big feast.

The work projects are: pouring a cement floor for the dining hall, repairing the roofs on the boys and girls dorms, repairing the water tank, building pews for the churches. The materials to do the work at the orphanage will cost approximately \$3,000.00.



Anna May and Tina are nurses and so they have been asked to conduct Medical Clinics at the Orphanage and also at 3 of the local churches. They will need supplies such as aspirin, Anti-biotic salve, bandages, . If you would like to donate medical supplies, please send to us so that Anna May and Tina can help the sick.

When Lacey told her we were going to Haiti again, Kym said she wanted to go to help as she had been helped. Kym is still kind hearted and wants the experience, but now she also wants to give back in the best way she can! Kym, Nathan & Tori are working hard to raise their own money to make this trip. I know I'm asking a lot, but if you would like to help them make this trip to Haiti, I know it would be appreciated!

Every year we ask for money for Christmas gifts. We do not buy the normal Christmas gifts as we would for our kids, we buy items to make their life better and easier: new mattresses, new utensils, dishes, bedding, clothes, under garments, socks, shoes, backpacks, etc. This year the need is great! An example: because

of damage to the roof, 20 mattresses need to be replaced. If you can, please give a little extra for the JLMH Christmas fund! We will be collecting money until the first of January for this fund.
