We just completed the Gala week for the school. The children had a fine time. The school is now 14 years old. Thanks for your prayers and support.

The children are well and doing well though some of them don't want to be serious, they need prayers to catch up with their friends.

The churches are doing their best for the Lord in such a hard country of ours. Prices keep going up with no control. We only praise the Lord that we are still alive by His grace.

Today the church in Whenten is putting down their building in Nimba County. They have their clay blocks made and kept them for the dry seasons. We pray that the building will go up before the rains increase. We will get them some roofing sheets to secure their building.

By the grace of God we have planted new churches which have reached our churches to 30 in all. Please pray with us for the preachers that are in the Towns where have these churches. We know that Lord will help them through your prayers.

I'm married to a beautiful and strong wife name Manuella Joseph with whom I have 2 children, a boy and a girl name Amsley Jun Saint juste he will be 4 years old in September this year. And Saïna Junah Saint Juste she's one year and 3 month old.



I was baptized in August 2004 about 15 years ago. I was lead by my family, since I was born I find my families serving God as Christians. It was about time when I finally make the decision to get baptized. I became a evangelist as after God has call me too. As I spend most of my life in the USA, finishing middle school in the state then all high school, and all college.

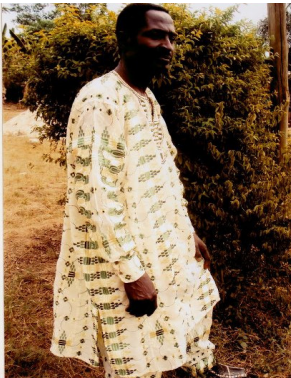
But while I was in college I always had these what was to me at the time "weird dreams" of me preaching in a church in Haiti in Creole. It was weird because I for one I was not a preacher nor did I ever thought about returning to Haiti to live. So that was the reasons why those dreams make no sense. But as the years go by I kept having these exact same dreams over and over, more and more often. Therefore after the earthquake of January 12 2010 I came to Haiti to help my father who was a doctor and preacher in mobile clinic for the victims.

From that I start coming to Haiti more and more often. Met my wife in 2012 got married 2014. My father passed away 2015 and here I am taking over where he left off. I now understand what God was training me for, wish is it was much too early retirement of my father in the work of the Lord. He was only 61 years old and very strong he always say " I can give the Lord another 40 years but unfortunately the Lord had his own plan.

My favorite part of being a evangelist is seeing lost souls come to Christ and be baptized. If I must share one thing about my country it's probably not what most people would say or think about Haiti. In my experience as an evangelist in Haiti I realized: as poor as the nation may be they are also more receptive of the Gospel of Christ then most other country. In my experience in preaching in the United States to unbelievers they always seem to have such a solid position on why they don't believe in God. Contrary with the Haitian people who so thirsty for hope and Esperance. And even through that thirst they manage to maintain a dignity so high in the Christian community that you won't even be able to realize how poor they really are until they became your friend and trust you enough to reveal that to you. I'm talking about as poor as can't feeding their kids for days. God has given me to those very people as someone the can trust and reveal the true situation to me among the Promise Land churches so I can help them as the Lord provide. My home is here with them, my 35 orphan children that the Lord has trusted me with. In the Promise Land Orphanage, and churches and Christian schools. In conclusion I would love to thank the White Fields ministry all the members and supporters of the White Fields as I represent in Haiti, for all your support you have provided for the churches for every bit count. I visited with them last Saturday, have evening revival, and then Sunday service during which time two persons were baptized into Christ.



Brother James is doing very well with the church but he and his family are going through hardship; as you see him, see him as a complete example of preachers of the interior. He needs your prayers.



This building was constructed between 1999 and 2000 with the least quality zinc (14g) that suppose to last for at least seven years depending on location has now gone for 18 years. This can no longer prevent water, they need 10 bundles of zinc at 80USD (\$800), 300 USD for timbers to save them from the approaching rain. The church needs your prayers.
