

## Well done, good and faithful servant

This newsletter will be different, but it will be special. This month will be a memorial to a great preacher, a great soul winner, a great friend, and my Dad.

Reginald Gregg 'Reggie' Thomas, age 91, Joplin, passed away Monday, March 2, 2020 at Mercy Hospital after suffering from a stroke.

Reggie was born January 8, 1929 in Joplin, Missouri to the late A.R. Thomas and Florence Higginbotham Thomas. He was baptized at the age of eight years in the South Joplin Christian Church, Joplin, Missouri. In 1943 he and his parents moved to Miami, Oklahoma, where he became very active in the First Christian Church. He dedicated his life to a specific Christian service at the age of 16, and under the ministry of Russell L. Martin was inspired to begin preaching immediately. He gradu-



ated from Miami High School in 1947 and attended Cincinnati Bible seminary, graduating in 1951 with a Bachelor of Arts degree.

Reggie was a full-time evangelist, and his work took him to many parts of the world. He served 3 located ministries; 1955-1961 Catlin Church of Christ, Catlin, Illinois, 1961-1966 East Point Christian Church, East Point, Ga, and 1979-1987 Hickory Valley Christian Church, Chattanooga, TN. The other years he spent travelling worldwide. In 1978 he organized White Fields Overseas Evangelism. It is the goal of White Fields to take the Gospel to every nation. He traveled to 83 nations, established over 700 churches, and over 400,000 baptisms. Many people have shared in these crusades including his own family. On July 1, 2017, Reggie realized it was time to slow down and retire. He asked his youngest daughter Lori to be the Director of White Fields.

During his retirement, Reggie wrote a book of his memories at located ministries and a few from his time as a traveling Evangelist.

Reggie loved his family with all his heart. He cherished the time he spent with them. He will be missed by everyone that knew and loved him.

He married Esther Matthews on December 17, 1977 in Lamar, Missouri. She survives at the home.

Additional survivors include his children, Tony Thomas and wife, Christie, Tracy Thomas and wife, Janie, Chris Henson and husband, Mark, Tim Thomas and wife, Sandy, Teresa Diener, and husband, Bud, Lori Darnell and husband, Zane;

twenty six grandchildren; forty three great grandchildren a sister, Barbara Barger; a brother, Ed Thomas; nieces, nephews, and extended family members.



In addition to his parents, Reggie was preceded in death by two sons, Terry Thomas and Tom Fullerton.

In lieu of flowers, memorial contributions can be made to White Fields Overseas Evangelism.

As we sat around the ICU bed with Reggie, we talked about his life, we told stories. As we were grieving we were also praising God. We are thankful for the long, active life God allowed him to have. That sight brought new tears to our eyes. Was it worth it?

His dedication was tremendous, it was a sacrifice. Was it worth it?

Sunday, March 1, Reggie rose early for choir practice at church, Sang with the choir during the service, and practiced again afterwards.



After lunch, he sat down and emailed some of the White Fields preachers his weekly encouraging notes. In the early hours of Monday, March 2, he unexpectantly suffered a massive stroke. He happily served right up until he was called Home. Was it worth it?

Boy, was I wrong, because you see, it's hard to put into words and keep it short of a novel length., Reggie and his family walked into my world in 1979 I believe when Reggie became the minister of Hickory Valley Christian Church in Chattanooga, TN. I loved them instantly and Reggie really "got" me and my quirky sense of humor and that created a bond that would last for over 40 years. Through Reggie, I became involved with White Fields Overseas Evangelism which has blessed my life so much I can't express it! Some of you may not agree, but I know that Reggie asked the Good LORD to help me! And yet again it was "the least of these things " it mattered to this great man.

The world is a much emptier place now for all of us left behind, but oh my, how full heaven is with our beloved Reggie. And I am so glad we have the promise of being reunited with all our loved ones some day, and that we will again hear that wonderful laugh of Reggie Thomas.
