I invited preachers from different villages to come join us.

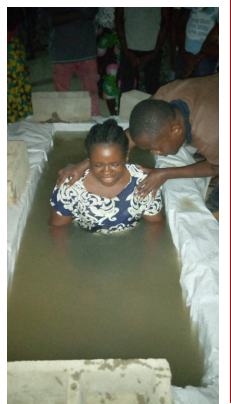

Promise Land Preachers & Kids– Haiti

I have 7 new baptism and 25 in the other churches. A total of 32. More then 30 new members at the church I lead. Most of the other churches have grown in number also. The one church we have problems with is the congregation by the airport, whom are now starting to scatter do to a church building that we don't have for them. We were kicked out of the building we were using a few weeks ago. We have land where I'd like to build a church building. I hope by them seeing the church started they will remain hopeful and not all scatter. I call this planting the seed of faith.

God has blessed us with more than \$10,000 worth of stuff for the orphanage from Lori and Zane. The Lord has blessed us with a school for our needs, 3 classroom were paid for by CMF. The Lord had blessed us with good credit from the local hardware and fabric store, who give us materials on credit for the other 9 classes we needed. We now have 12 classes

build and are schooling 220 children. 40 orphans and 180 Christian children in our neighborhood that couldn't afford going to school.

In our 40 orphans, 3 are handicap. We are in desperate need of transportation means I have a pickup truck but it has broken down. We need a bus to transport our kids.

Review of 2019

Jean Ronel Joseph, Pignon, Haiti 2019 a Challenging year

What God told Joshua led us through that difficult year to be “strong and courageous.” The political unrest started at the end of 2018. And people thought that 2019 would be different. It will be a peaceful and profitable year. But unfortunately, that was not the case, instead it was a year where a new system showed up which they called “locked.” This word took place among the opposition that stands against the government. They want the president to resign which he doesn’t want to do. Since January until now, people have been invading the streets protesting in violent ways, burning anything they find on their way, and killing each other.

We have been having a humanitarian crisis that I haven’t seen in Haiti since I was born. This was my first time to experience this kind of hardship. The result of the “locked” is that supplies cannot go from one city to another or even to the small communities as they all get their supplies from the cities, mainly Port-au-Prince. A cup of beans that costed 50 gourds in January costs now in November 100 gourds. I took this as an example but the price of everything has been doubled or tripled at some point.

A gallon of gasoline cost 1500 gourds during the “locked”. In many cities in Haiti, there is no school as the “locked” movement prevents many kids from going to school until today. They even attacked some churches in some areas. But thanks be to God in Pignon, things has been better in terms of calm and tranquility. Kids here in Pignon have started going to school since September 9. This has been a blessing for us that our kids could go to school. We feel the weight, the expensiveness of life and the difficulty of Haiti affects all the Haitian fellows and even our friends that really care for us here. So we appreciate the kinds words that we have been receiving from friends everywhere daily to encourage and comfort us during the political unrest which still continues. But this difficulty didn’t stop us from continuing the progress at First Christian Church of Terre, Mark’s Home and Kids Club Pignon.

First Christian Church

We still continue to spread the Good News. We have about 20 new converts (kids, youths plus adults) during this year. We only have about 10 that got baptize after so much encouragement. But some of them can’t do it as they are men and women that are living together outside the marriage institution. In 2017 there was an organization that accompanied some couples in the areas of Pignon to get married by providing the basic things to get married like (suits, t-shirts and tie, rings, shoes, dresses...). They married 20 couples in 2017 in which FCC had two couples among them and in 2018 they married 42 couples in which FCC had one couple from them and this year they will be marry 21 couples which FCC will have 2 couples in this program. And as a result these couples will be baptized and presented their kids right after their wedding.

So it is a big ministry, as many people in the rural communities don’t get married. Most of the times they want to, but they cannot afford it, so to find someone to help along with the basics are really important. We continue to pray that God will provide for those that haven’t married yet to make the decision to do it and to find means to do that. I have been nourishing this idea which is to accompany at least 20 women in the church that can make businesses. And also we want to find some friends that want to sponsor a child to go to school. We have some at the church and it breaks our hearts as leaders to see kids stay home and don’t go to school. FCC wants to find friends that can assist at least to begin sponsoring five of these kiddos.

And then at last, FCC’s sanctuary is not finished with the tale yet only the pulpit and the hall way are finished, the two sides still need to finish. We have over 20 kids at FCC and during the service they take the attention of the parents away and prevent them from concentrating on God’s words, it’s our prayer that God provides for a gazebo to have special class for them during preaching time. And then also pray that our musical instruments be completed to worship God. I remember Reggie said he has two trumpets, we would be glad to have them at FCC.

Mark’s Home

M.H continues its mission which is to take good care of Kids and be a shoulder that they can lean on. We still continue to care for our 10 boys, we always thank God for using Tooger Smith and his Wife Charlottes to provide for M.H. *we Thank God as well for the friends of White Field Oversees Evangelism for their generosity as well to continue to stand by us. We thank God for you guys every day and also for you that have been praying for us. The boys are growing very well, physically and spiritually. When the boys came in 2016, Nadine and I used to shower them every Sunday morning for church and during the week our employees had to help with that for school. But our boys have grown up so much that they don’t want to be showered by us any more, the good thing is the older boys help the little ones with that. Doubensky and Estenson do some little preaching at the prayer service in the church on Thursday and the others help lead service sometimes. I used to shave their hair all the time, but now Elson shaves my hair for me, so no need to find someone else to do it for me anymore, they are doing well and are learning. None of them repeated class, they are working hard. Now, I want to start introducing music classes that will help them to be even more useful in the Lord’s Hands.*

My wife, our baby and I have been living in one room and all the boys as well have been living in one room as well since we moved to our property in 2017. But, thanks to God who provided money so that we could build a house for my family to stay, with that the boys will have two rooms now to live which will be more comfortable for them as the last time the social welfare services stopped by at Mark’s Home they were not happy with me for putting the boys in one room and no tile, but thanks be to God that 2020 will be different and hopefully when they stop by again they will be happy.

We are all really happy to live a bit more comfortable. With the building of the new house, we even added a space to take girls at M.H. in 2020. So, we thank God for the progress we have made through the hardship of life in Haiti. There are a lot of needs and being able to add girls at M.H. will alleviate so many little orphans that don’t have anyone to care for them. So thanks a lot and keep up the good work.

Kids Club Pignon

This is a ministry that I really treasure and always make time for these kiddos. Every Saturday from 2 to 4 O’clock, we meet these kids to teach them the word of God and spend quality time with them. The boys at M.H. like it when I take them to Kids Club. This December we will have some activities like soccer championship the boys at M.H. will participate. Unfortunately, because of the way things are now in Haiti, I don’t know how I will be able to get some Christmas gifts for them to share with them at our Christmas party as we always do since we started in 2014. But God knows and will provide and we trust His provision...
