Happy to inform you that we are having a great opportunity to share the Gospel during our distribution without any problem and disturbances by any strong Hindu people or RSS and BJP. People are listening to the Good News very keenly with much interest and believe Jesus Christ is the True and only God. Many people are showing interest in Baptism.



These people are living in poverty (very bad situation) and they won't send their children to School.



They will catch fish and rats to eat with rice. They are working as a slave to some landlords and rich people's houses. They do not have permanent houses to live. All are living in a thatched roof that you have to bow your heads to enter into the house that is 10 feet by 10 feet and at least 5 to 8 people and sometimes more have to live and sleep. They do not have bathroom for the ladies to use. Ladies are struggling a lot during the daytime.

They are the poorest people among the poor in this area. While I was sharing the Gospel they listened with good spirit and believed Jesus is the Lord. (This is the first time they are hearing the Gospel.) Few women wanted to accept Jesus as their personal Savior but they need their husband and community permission. I encouraged them and advised them to send their children to the school and be clean and hygienic. They do not know what is COVID-19, they are sitting very closely and touching each other, and no cleanliness and taking baths with dirty cloths. I am planning to go and visit them often, and help their children by educating them and arranging evening school and teach them Gospel and bring them from the darkness to Light of Jesus.

Please pray for these people's salvation and open their spiritual eyes to come to Christ Jesus. (This is not a easy job, there is a lot of opposition and problems from the landlords and rich people and high caste who are using them as a slave and less payment.) I need your prayers and support for this project.

I will first express my deepest condolences to all families who have lost their beloveds to COVID-19 especially in the United States which seem to have gone out of hand. My heart felt prayer is that, the Lord keep us as he did with the Israelites when they were on the land of Pharo. Amen

Due to restrictions on social gatherings, we used to meet ourselves in pairs and three's (like running shifts at work places) at home, to share the word of God and partake in the holy communion. Not everyone could come but at least it was a bit comforting. My dad called the other church branches leaders to do same. And they also joined in doing same.

Our country's President, recently has eased these restrictions a little which will allow us to go to church providing we're able to follow certain protocols;

1. Not more than 100 congregants
2. Spaces between seats
3. Compulsory face/nose mask
4. Provision/availability of water, soap, sanitizers and tissue papers
5. Thermometer to check temperature before entry
6. Worship time should not exceed 1 hour
7. No children

These are basically the laid down rules for us to follow and we're hoping to abide by them accordingly,

1. for the sake of our own safety (even though our protection comes from the Lord, we shouldn't relax and take that for granted and be careless) and,

2. To prevent having issues with security personnel sent by the government to enforce these governmental directives.

We will be meeting this coming Sunday to see if it works then, we will definitely continue but if it proves to be otherwise, then we will probably do it as we used to at home.

You can share with us too if you have any suggestions to add or deduct from what we intend doing.

My warm greetings to everyone. Let's keep our hope, because with Christ in and with us, our glory is assured.

May the Lord keep us and let his face shine upon us. Amen and Amen.

It has been a bad time for everyone in the world. We thank God that we are all still alive by the grace of the Lord. Churches have been closed here since the 22nd of March 2020. You will see that the attendance will not be regular for some churches in the report. Some churches were not allowed to have service at all while some had partial service and the police will drive them out.

We were forced to move our orphanage fence gate to the right side of the gate because our neighbor that has passed through our school fence for years decided to stop us from passing through his land to our school. So we had to open the doors to another neighbor who agreed to share land with us for a passage to get on the alley. We completed it on Wednesday the 13th of May. I am sending you some pictures for you to see. It cost us much money, but we had no way out. We were kept in the fence for two weeks without going out with the bus until we opened the new way.

Pray with us for churches to be opened in Guinea again. We trust that the Lord will help us soon. I am sending you some pictures of our secret services in our house for you to see.

All the church members are locked down and most of them depend on selling small things to make a living. Since we must all get out of the streets by 3pm, it makes hard for them to get even food some days. Please pray with us for them.



Churches opened here on the 3rd Sunday of May. Services have been good since. We are safe here than there. God has been good to us knowing that we have nothing here to prevent us from the virus. We know that it will come to an end soon by the grace of our Lord.

This report covers the resumption of our church and church related activities immediately as of May 17th 2020 {that was when our government announced the reopening of churches.}

On the 21th of March 2020 due to the Corona virus (Covid-19) outbreak in Liberia, our government declared a state of health emergency and introduced lockdown measures including the suspension of all public gathering with immediately effect, all churches within the quarantined counties were shut down immediately, the measure remain in place throughout the month of April 2020 until the 17th of May at which time churches were allow to reopen but with all precautionary measures in place.



I am very glad to inform you that by the special grace and mercy of God, all of our families and church members are reporting well and safe, the only exceptional was a tragic fire disaster that gutted the home of one couple of our church, no lives were lost in the incident but their home was completely destroyed to the ground leaving them homeless. This unfortunate situation occur during the lockdown period in April, 2020.
