Earthquake Hits Southern Haiti

On August 14th a 7.2 earthquake hit the Southern peninsula of Haiti. The epicenter was close to Les Cayes. The tremors were felt way up in Gonaives and further north in Pignon. Death count is now 2,220, with over 13,000 injured, 300-400 still missing and 52,000 homes destroyed.



This comes a little over a month after the President, Jovenal Moise, was assassinated. Two days after the earthquake, Haiti was hit head on by tropical storm Grace. The epicenter area was also hit the hardest by this storm.

From the New York Times: *TOIRAC, Haiti — The destruction was everywhere. The help nowhere.*

Days after a magnitude 7.2 earthquake devastated part of Haiti's southern peninsula, the hillside village of Toirac had yet to be visited by any emergency authorities or aid groups. At least 20 Toirac villagers who had been attending a funeral when the quake struck on Saturday were killed as the church collapsed, survivors said.

With some help from Boy Scouts, the Toirac villagers dug out their dead loved ones, buried them in mass graves and built makeshift shelters as Tropical Storm Grace pelted the area with heavy rain that caused floods and mudslides. The villagers used salvaged pieces of their collapsed houses.

"I don't expect any help, we're on our own," said

Michel Milord, a 66-year-old farmer in Toirac, who lost his wife and his house in the earthquake. "No one trusts this government here."



Earthquake Hits Southern Haiti



The only road linking Port-au-Prince to the affected area — normally a four-hour drive — remains plagued by gang violence, derailing some aid deliveries. Air-lifts were delayed by Tropical Storm Grace, which passed over Haiti on Monday. According to



local residents, some relief supplies that had been intended for more remote mountain communities never reached their destination, having been commandeered on the way.

And the Haitian government, which has promised to centralize and coordinate the relief effort, has been largely absent from the affected communities.

Haiti was plunged into disarray by the assassination of President Jovenel Moïse last month. The country is now facing the earthquake's aftermath without a president, a functioning parliament or a head of the Supreme Court. The caretaker government that took power after Mr. Moïse's death lacks political experience, money and legitimacy in the eyes of most Haitians.

Even in this time of need, the gangs are still being ruthless. They are robbing and hijacking aid trucks and deliveries along the roads. This has left many organizations being forced to not help or charter small planes and helicopters to get aid to the needy.

Jean St Juste was able to go so far by truck then walked more than 4 hours by foot to try to help. Ronel Joseph was invited as a translator for another Pignon mission to fly to Les Cayes to help. They both report the needs are overwhelming. Food and water are the most needed.

Two of our churches with the Promised Land churches sustained damage. If you would like to help with earthquake relief, we have a way to get money and/or food directly into the hands of people who need the help.

Please continue to pray for Haiti.
